Author/Illustrator **Don Tate** dedicated a book he illustrated, *Carter Reads the Newspaper*, to Books 4 Buddies. When asked by B4B cofounder Laneta Goings why he so generously did so, he replied with the following:


"Honestly, the thing that most impressed me about our meeting that day was 1) You. Your love for those boys really impressed upon me. Your giving back to your community by uplifting young men, who then uplift younger men – through the gift of reading. What a treasure you are.

2) I was impressed with the young men. So often, I meet our young black men and they have no confidence. They lower their heads and do not look me in the eye when speaking. Oftentimes, they can be a bit aloof even, which may be more worrying about what others around them will think. But the young men at Books4Buddies were enthusiastic when greeting me that morning. I didn't feel like they were forced to be there, they were genuine. They smiled when they met me, shook my hand confidently. Then each shared with me some of their goals and their artwork. Obvious readers themselves, they were articulate in the way they expressed themselves. They are our future leaders, and I was proud of them – and you. And I hoped my little dedication would show my gratitude."

Carter Reads the Newspaper is a biography of Carter G. Woodson, historian, author, journalist, Howard University Dean and "the father of Black History," who was born in

1875 to two formerly enslaved parents. He read to his illiterate parents and coworkers as a young man, and dedicated his life to the importance of black history and education.

University of Michigan Stephen Ross Business School Community Consulting Club Works with Books4Buddies

The University of Michigan Community Consulting Club (CCC) was established in 1999. It is designed to work with small nonprofits and the students focus on core programs (impact and outcomes).

The CCC students, who hail from a variety of local communities, as well as from far away as New York and Beijing, traveled from Ann Arbor to meet the Books4Buddies board, including cofounder Laneta Goings; Library officials; a Lucas County Sheriff's representative and an American Cultural Exchange Services (ACES) administrator to discuss the global literacy program.

The UM/CCC, Stephen Ross Business School and Books4Buddies collaborated on a 10-week program designed to develop strategic planning tools, said Marites Seitz, CCC team leader.

"Over the course, we have had the privilege of spending time with some key stakeholders in Books4buddies, including Laneta and see the passion and focus in which B4B operates. The organization is extremely mission driven

and they know it does have an impact in the Toledo and global community and want to measure and deepen that impact. Everyone we've spoken with is very knowledgeable of the needs of the greater community, which is inspiring to see," said Seitz.

The CCC students presented its strategic recommendations at the end of January 2020. They advised B4B on strategy and, just as importantly, helped "in measuring

their impact, both internally and externally, so that they can leverage information to achieve their goals of growth and deepening the B4B community ties," said Seitz.











SPOTLIGHT on Global Ambassador Brandon Jackson

Books4Buddies ambassador Brandon Jackson (a B4B founding member), a Rogers High School and The Ohio State University grad, and Evan's scholarship recipient, is now a professional caddy and a global B4B ambassador. We asked him to tell us about his experience as a professional caddy.

What is caddy life like on tour?

Life on tour is pretty hectic especially during these times but also a lot of fun. The travel takes some time getting used to but I'm slowly getting used to it.

What is it like to be a caddy?

I have been caddying since I was 13 years old so caddying is almost like second nature to me at this point. But, caddying on tour has added a little more focus and concentration in my

preparation which has been really

fun.

How were you chosen?

I was helping out at Stone Oak Country Club and I ran into Bianca Pagdanganan on the golf course. We ended up talking about the Inverness Club tournament that was coming up and one thing lead to another. It was truly a blessing how it happened.

How long can/will you be caddying and can you turn professional?

There really isn't a set time it just depends on results and how our relationship grows over time.

I am technically considered a professional caddy now.

How many African American male/females are on the tour?

Mariah Stackhouse is the only fully exempt African American female on tour and there are about 10-15 African American caddies.

Can you tell us a bit about Bianca Pagdanganan, the golfer you caddy for?

Bianca Pagdanganan is 23 years old and is from the Philippines. Bianca played golf at Gonzaga University for two years and then transferred to Arizona University for her last two years. This is her first year on tour and she has currently played in seven professional events. As far as caddying for just her, it all depends on how the relationship goes and the results we produce.

There are a lot of cases where caddies move around to different people because the results aren't what the team is looking for. But, as far as my situation goes, I am locked in with Bianca until she tells me otherwise.

I am happy with the little time that we have spent together and the relationship that we have started to build. Hopefully we can continue to build off the good vibes and continue to get better each and every event.

What have you learned? What didn't you realize before about caddying?

I studied Professional Golf Management at Ohio State University. I have learned a lot in the first few weeks on tour but the most important thing that I have learned is just how important it is to stay calm no matter the circumstance. The more I can keep my composure, the more confidence that I can give to Bianca. What I didn't know was just how much

preparation it takes to fully prepare for a tournament. I have so much appreciation for my fellow caddies that have been on tour for a while

I was a Books4Buddies
Ambassador for two years (201214). During that time, it taught
me how to make a difference;
I learned just how important it
means to give back to others and
how impactful I could be in others'
lives. Being able to give to those
less fortunate a gift is incredible,
but to give them a gift such as a
book will impact their lives forever.
Books4Buddies reiterated to me

just how blessed I am and how I can be a blessing to others.

What is your long range goal?

Eventually I hope to pursue my dream of getting into sales in the golf business but for the moment I am enjoying the opportunity on tour and hope that we can continue to have success in the future.




